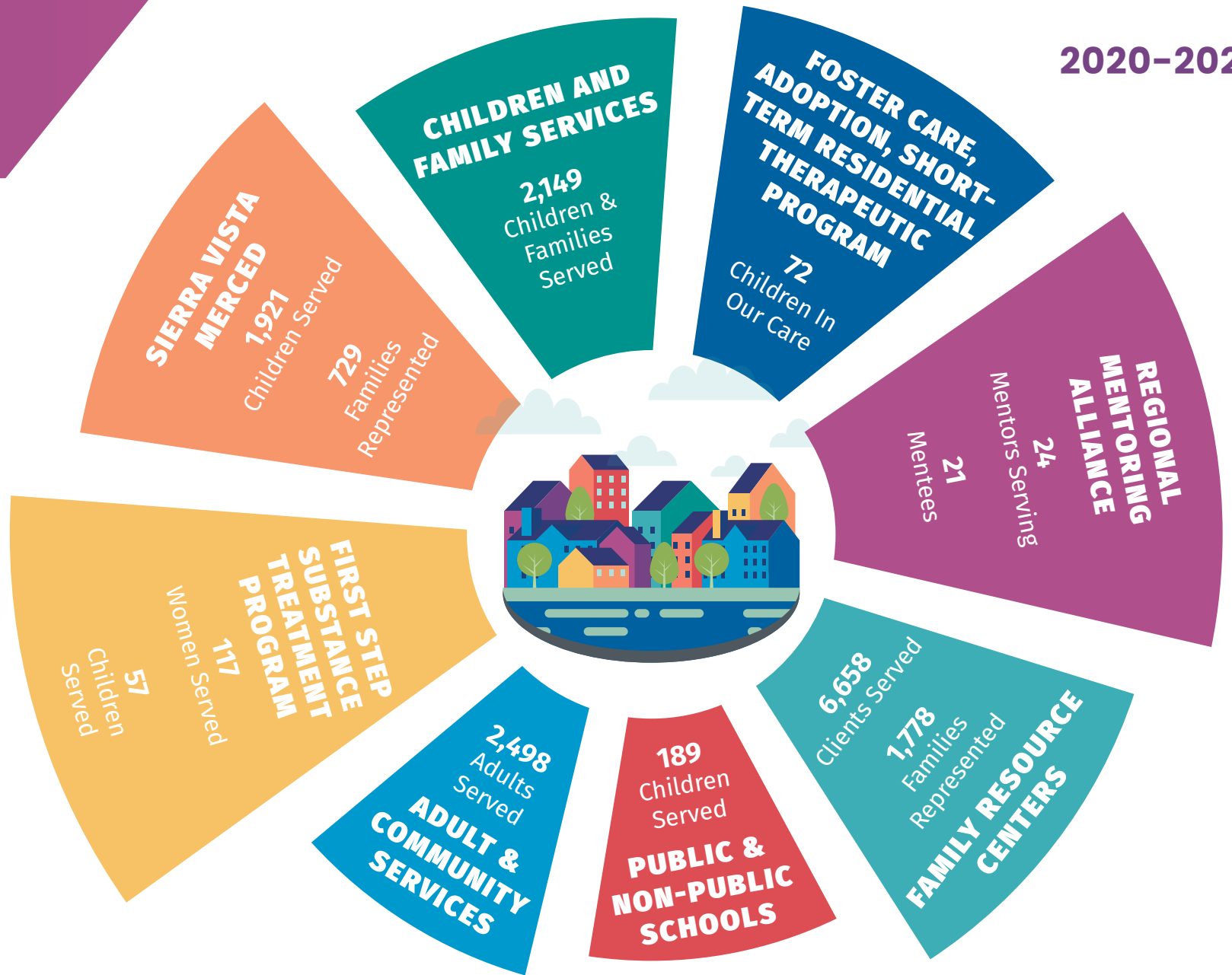

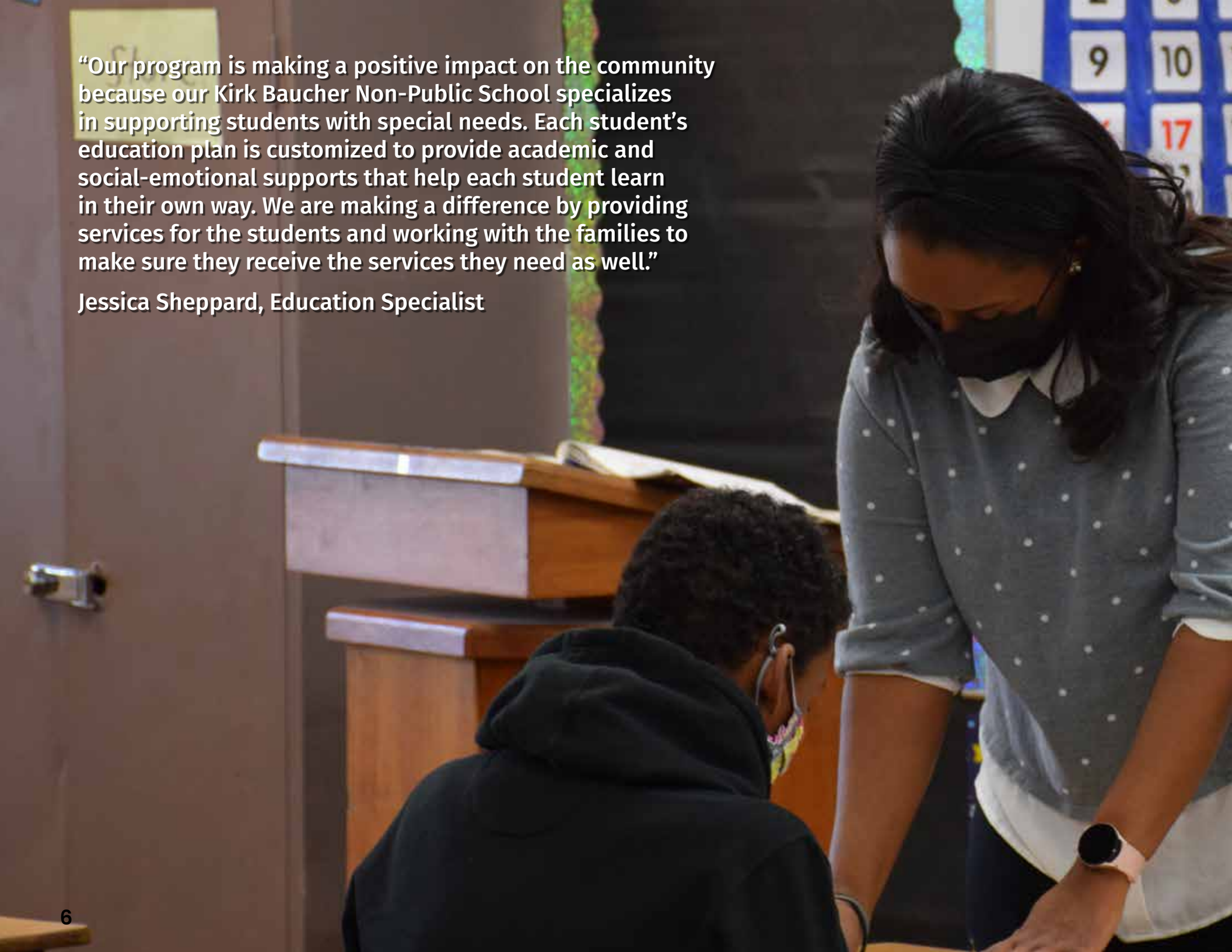

EDUCATING OUR FUTURE

Providing a safe and calm learning environment.

Our **Kirk Baucher Non-Public School** and **Sierra Vista Learning Center** provides special education for children in kindergarten through eighth grade. This specialized school setting offers individualized education services, social skills development, behavior management, crisis intervention, and family support. Our schools are certified by the California State Department of Education.

The program provides full academic assessment, a specialized curriculum for students with learning disabilities, including those on the autism spectrum, vocational education, crisis intervention, an activity program, and family counseling.

Education plans are designed to fit the individual needs of each student, kindergarten through eighth grade. Social skills training, art, music, drama, and community outings are some of the self-esteem building activities of the school program.

Advocating for the well-being of the children and families in our community.

Sierra Vista's **Intensive Community Support (ICS)** program provides mental health services including assessment, treatment, and support services in an outpatient setting. Referrals may come from a variety of sources, including schools, parents/ caregivers, and other community partners.

ICS Services vary based on individual needs and may include individual and family therapy, case management, rehabilitation, medication support, and crisis intervention. This program provides youth and their families with support to help reduce stress and impairment in the home, school, and community setting. This results in strengthened family connections and resiliency.

LIFE Path offers effective treatment and support to transitional age youth and adults ages 14-25, experiencing early symptoms of psychosis. LIFE Path provides education and support to the family and a support network to each youth and adult. LIFE Path is a partnership with Sierra Vista Child & Family Services and Center for Human Services.

Focusing on improving the lives of children, youth, families & communities.

Our community-based **Family Resource Centers** focus on improving the well-being of children, youth, families, and communities. Our goal is to ensure that the children and families in our area are provided the necessary access to programs and services by providing outreach and support services.

Bridge Family Resource Center is a cross-cultural community center that provides family support, case management, interpretation, and acculturation to Southeast Asian refugee families and their descendants.

Drop-In Family Resource Center is in the heart of West Modesto, providing the necessary resources to strengthen and unify neighborhoods.

Hughson Family Resource Center is located in the rural agricultural community of Hughson. It serves southeast Stanislaus County including Hughson, Denair, Empire, Gratton, and Roberts Ferry.

North Modesto Family Resource Center provides community services impacting families in North Modesto and Salida.

Waterford Family Resource Center provides services to the city of Waterford as well as Hickman, and LaGrange. Our connection to the community enhances the health, education, and well-being of the children and families served.

Assisting and supporting women in developing positive parenting skills while learning to live a healthy, drug and alcohol-free life.

First Step Substance Abuse Treatment Program is a drug and alcohol treatment program for pregnant, postpartum, and parenting women and their children. The program is designed in a multi-phase model that can take eight to eighteen months, depending on the clients needs.

First Step is a collaborative effort between Sierra Vista Child & Family Services and Center for Human Services. This program is licensed and certified by the State of California Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs. In addition, Anger Management Groups and Domestic Violence Groups are offered through collaboration with the Haven Women's Center.



PROVIDING STABILITY & CARE

Be someone who matters to someone who matters.

The **Regional Mentoring Alliance** brings together mentors, mentees, educators, businesses, community leaders, and community-based organizations. It empowers them with the knowledge, skills, and training necessary to create a culture of mentoring in our community through becoming mentors, advocates, and supporters of our youth.

Our volunteer mentors meet with their students (mentees) for one hour per week at the student's school. The goal is to build a positive relationship that focuses on supporting the student's social and academic development and enhancing the student's overall school experience. Having a mentor significantly increases a student's potential for success. Children and youth who have mentors experience improved self-esteem, greater academic achievement, increased motivation in school, and higher quality lifestyle choices. A listening ear, accountability, and a caring role model are all it takes to transform the lives of these children.

Research shows that children who succeed despite enormous personal, economic or environmental challenges often do so because of committed and supportive positive role models who believe in them.

Open your heart and open your home, provide a child a forever family.

Our **Foster Care & Adoption Program** provides safe and nurturing homes for children removed from their biological families. We help these children achieve permanency through reunification with their families, establishing lifelong connections, or guardianship. The resource parents we serve also have the opportunity to expand their families through the process of adoption. We help create a trauma-informed community by providing our families training on the impact of trauma on a child's development and how to minimize its effects. Children living in foster care are among our nation's most vulnerable young people. Many have experienced trauma, resulting in many emotional and developmental needs. Because the lives of these children are often fraught with instability and frequent moves, they can benefit tremendously from being in a caring and nurturing family.

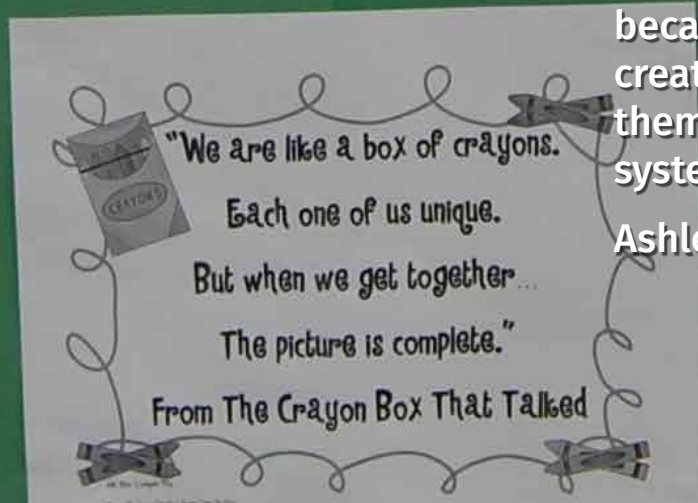
We provide two **Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP)** group homes for children that struggle in regular foster care or in-home placements. These children need specialized 24-hour care to ensure their safety and well-being. The homes are located in clean, safe, and family-oriented neighborhoods. We provide caring, nurturing, and highly trained staff that ensure these children receive the most current, therapeutic, and behavioral interventions.

We are dedicated to the success of every child in Merced County.

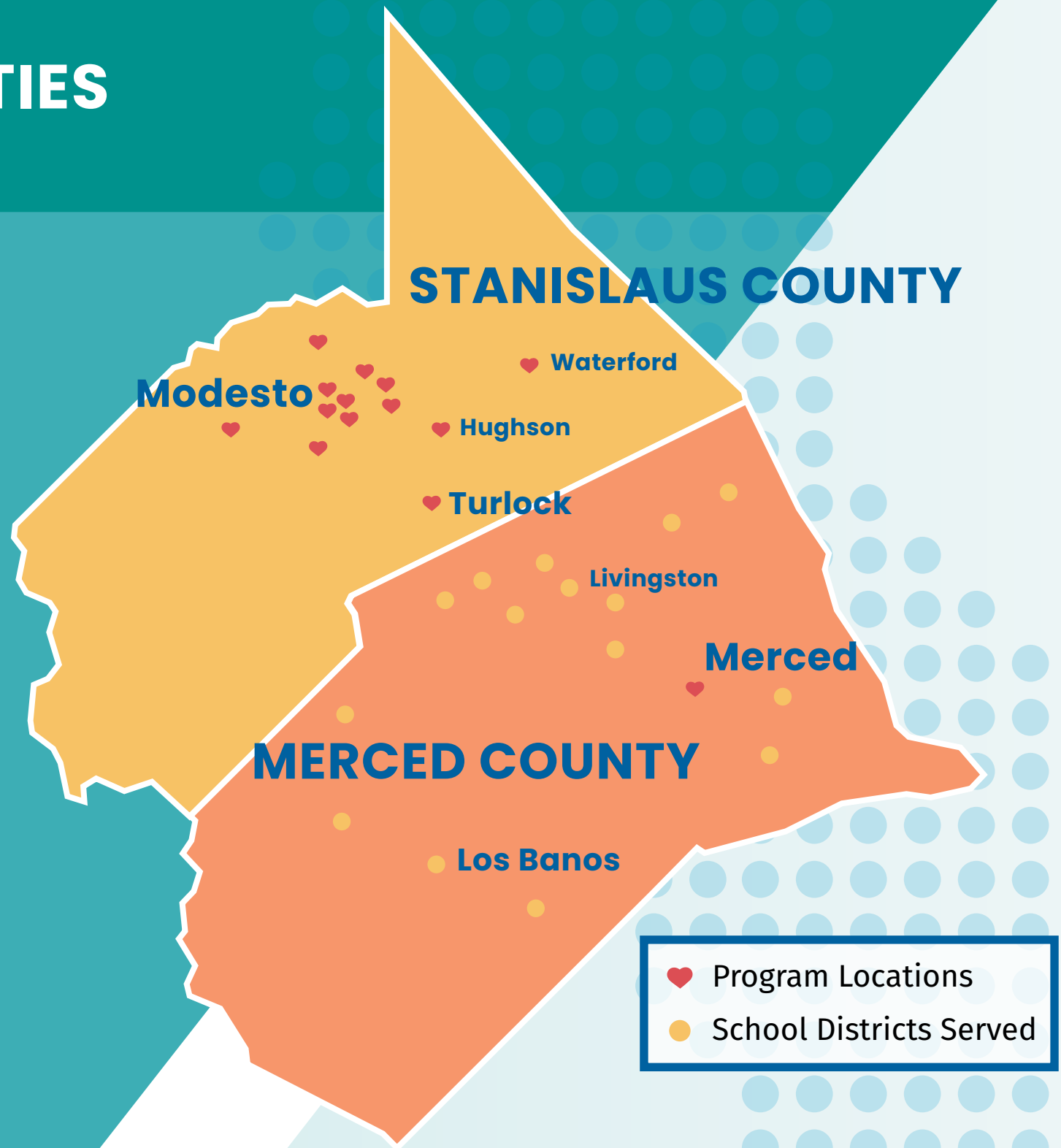
Our **Sierra Vista Merced** programs in Merced County offer many services to families both in our office and in the community. Sierra Vista Merced reaches 16 cities within Merced County. Clinicians provide screening and assessment to identify social, emotional, and behavioral symptoms. In addition, individual, family, parent, and crisis counseling are available to assist students with specific issues that significantly interfere with their level of functioning. We work with families with children 0-5, enrolled in Head Start, in school K-12th grade, and families with Alliance Healthcare Services.

The Merced office's mission is to provide services through partnerships that will enhance the health, education, and well-being of the families we serve.
