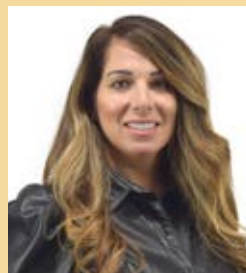

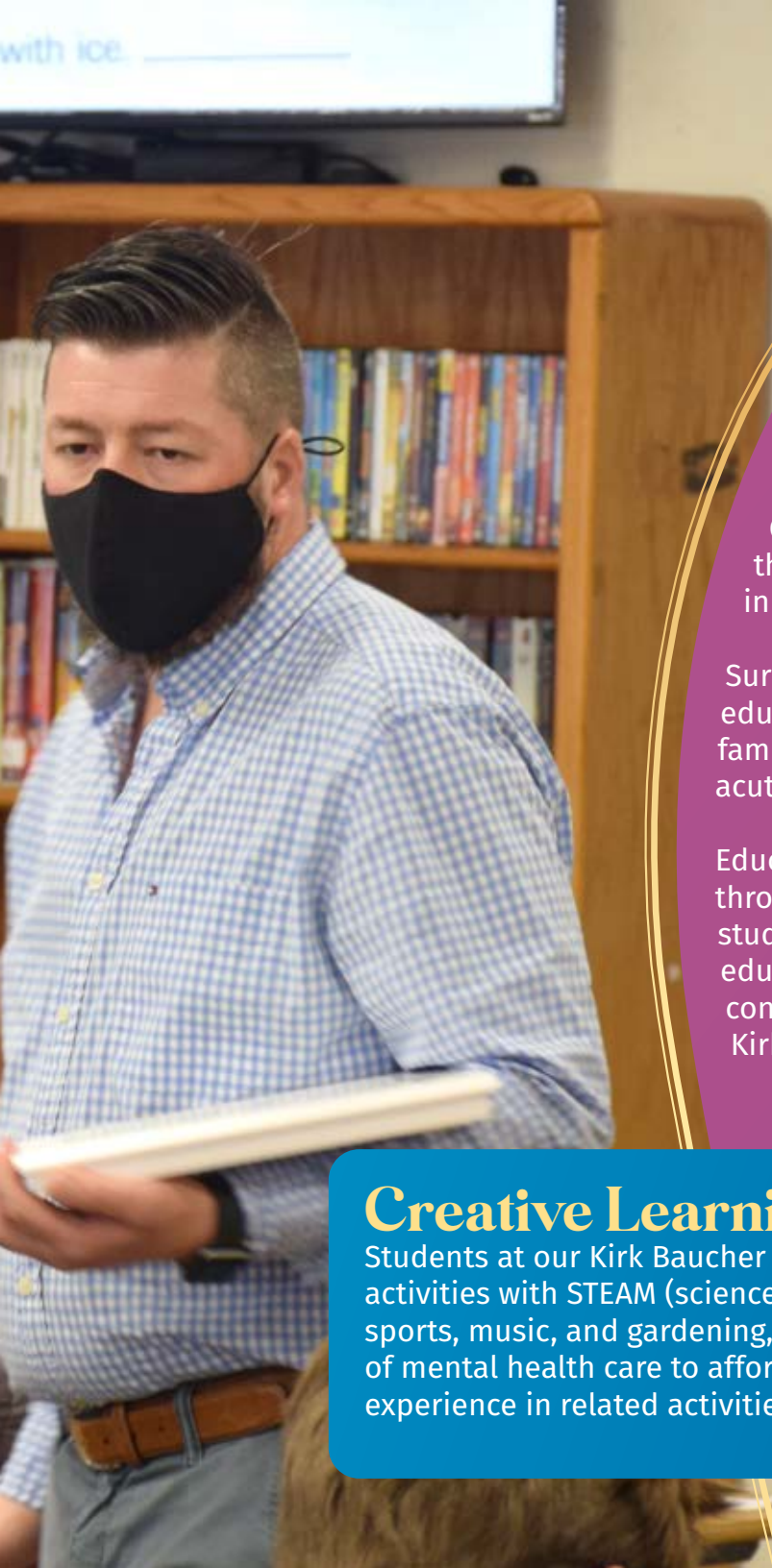

# ACHIEVING EXCELLENCE TOGETHER

Educating future leaders through specialized schooling.

In 1980, Sierra Vista Child & Family Services opened its doors to our **Kirk Baucher Non-Public School**, providing special education for kindergarten through eighth-grade students from the public school systems in Merced, Stanislaus, and San Joaquin Counties. We collaborate with school districts by providing specialized training in therapeutic crisis intervention to support the student's Individual Education Plan (IEP) in a therapeutic school environment.

Surrounded by almond groves, this specialized school setting offers individualized education services, social skills development, behavior management, crisis intervention, family support, and one-on-one mental health services. These services are provided in an acute therapeutic care setting, which is necessary for this environment.

Education plans are designed to fit the individual needs of each student, kindergarten through eighth grade. We provide a full academic assessment, a specialized curriculum for students with learning disabilities (including those on the autism spectrum), vocational education, crisis intervention, an activity program, and social work services that help connect the family to their child's treatment plan. Approximately 70% of 8th graders from Kirk Baucher Non-Public School transition into public schools.

## Creative Learning Matters

Students at our Kirk Baucher Non-Public School have access to activities with STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, math), sports, music, and gardening, which provides a full spectrum of mental health care to afford students the full benefit and experience in related activities.





# UNIFYING COMMUNITIES

Partnering with local neighborhoods to improve the lives of children and families.

Our community-based **Family Resource Centers** focus on improving the well-being of children, youth, families, and communities. Our goal is to ensure that the children and families in our area are provided the necessary access to programs and services by providing outreach and support services.

**Bridge Family Resource Center** is a cross-cultural community center for Southeast Asian refugee families and their descendants.

**Drop-In Family Resource Center** is in the heart of West Modesto, strengthening and unifying neighborhoods. Our Youth Assessment Center's goal is to prevent youth from formally entering the justice system to connect them to local resources.

**Hughson Family Resource Center** serves rural agricultural communities in Southeast Stanislaus County and provides a variety of community services to strengthen the family.

**North Modesto Family Resource Center** serves families in North Modesto and Salida and provides a variety of community services to strengthen the family.

**South Modesto Family Resource Center** provides community services to neighborhoods in South Modesto.

**Waterford Family Resource Center** provides services to the cities of Waterford, Hickman, Denair, and La Grange. Our connection to the community enhances the health, education, and well-being of the children and families served.

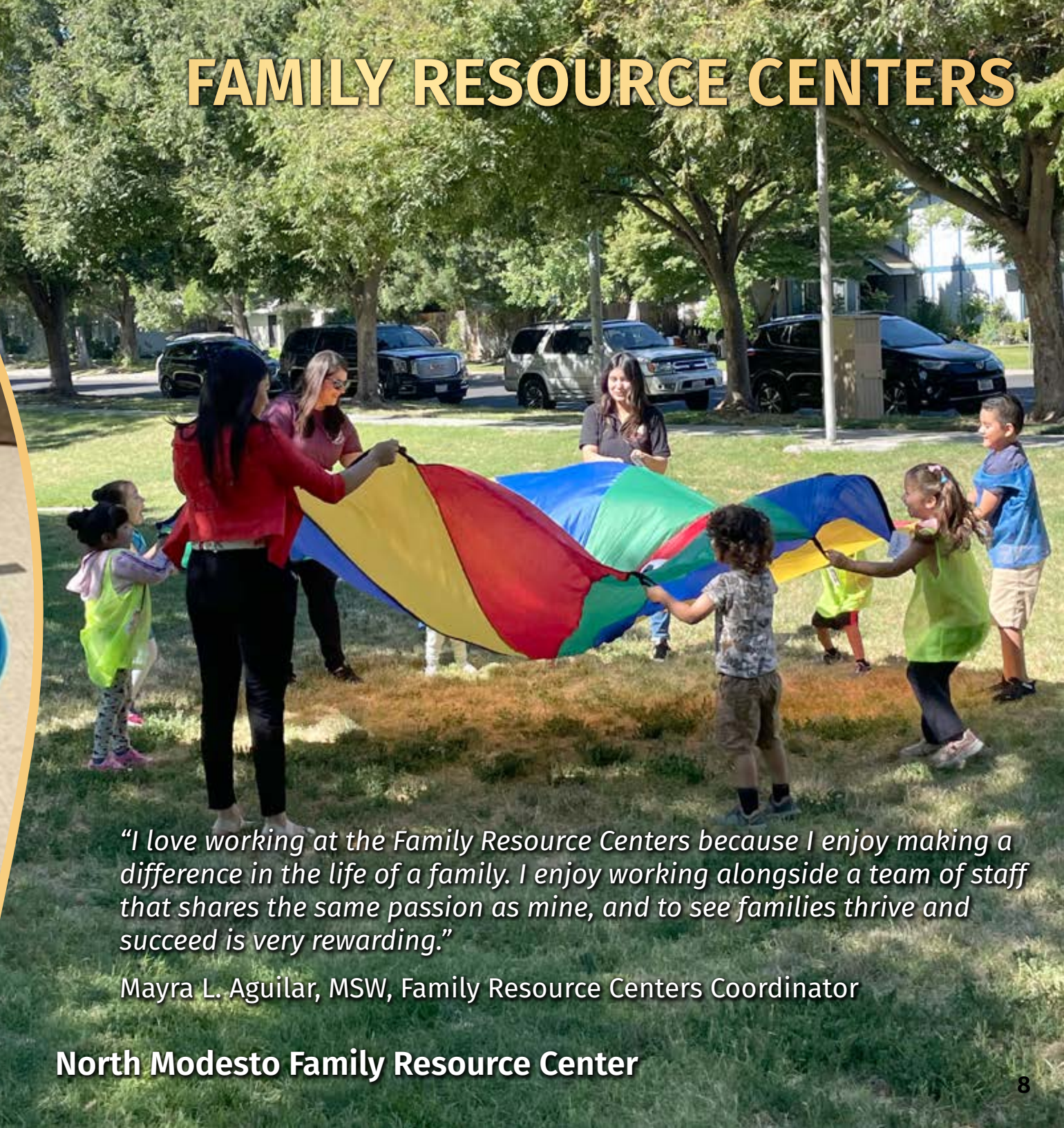


## Promotoras Women Empowerment

# CREATING CONNECTIONS

A listening ear, accountability, and a caring role model are all it takes to transform a child's life.

Sierra Vista Mentoring Program brings together mentors, mentees, educators, businesses, community leaders, and community-based organizations. It empowers them with the knowledge, skills, and training necessary to create a culture of mentoring in our community through becoming mentors, advocates, and supporters of our youth. Our mentoring program is in six schools in Modesto City Schools District.

Our volunteer mentors meet with their students (mentees) for one hour per week at the student's school. The goal is to build a positive relationship that focuses on supporting the student's social and academic development and enhances the student's overall school experience. Having a mentor significantly increases a student's potential for success because of committed and supportive positive role models who believe in them.

The mentoring program is positively impacting our students, with 76% of mentee caregivers reporting an improvement in their child's academic performance as a result of mentoring. Also, 87% of school administrators received positive feedback from mentee caregivers, indicating that the program was making a meaningful impact in their students' lives.

The consistent presence of a mentor provides students with a greater sense of worth, stability, community, and overall well-being! In addition, our mentors receive the gifts of enrichment, giving back, life experience, and being a part of a fantastic community.

# FOSTERING OUR FUTURE

Providing a supportive and stable family for children.

Our **Foster Care & Adoption Program** provides safe and nurturing homes for children removed from their biological families. We help these children achieve permanency through reunification with their families, establishing lifelong connections, or guardianship. Resource Parents have the opportunity to expand their families through the process of adoption. Sierra Vista provides ongoing trainings for our Resource Parents (Foster Parents), social events, and holiday gatherings for our foster youth and their families. In 2022, through our Foster Care and Adoption Program, we had 15 children adopted into loving homes.

We provide a **Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP)** with two homes located in family-oriented neighborhoods in the community. These children have not been safe in their families and require specialized 24-hour care to ensure their safety and well-being in a place where they can thrive. We provide caring, nurturing, and highly trained staff who ensure these children receive the most current, therapeutic, and behavioral interventions. As a result, last year 25% of our children stepped down from our residential homes and returned to safe family environments.

# BRINGING FAMILIES TOGETHER

Services that support adults in developing positive skills while learning to live a healthy and safe life.

## **Adult & Community Services**

Our program provides individual and family counseling services focused on child safety, permanency and stability, child well-being, and family well-being to keep children in their homes or reunify them with their parents. Adult & Community Services provides parenting groups that teach methods to prevent and break the cycle of family violence, anger management, and parenting education focused on identifying the development and emotional needs of the child.

## **First Step Perinatal Substance Abuse Program**

Sierra Vista Child & Family Services in collaboration with Center for Human Services operates the First Step Substance Abuse Treatment Program. First Step provides perinatal substance use treatment and gender-specific substance use treatment.

The program aims to assist women in maintaining a drug and alcohol-free lifestyle. Women are taught skills to develop and maintain healthy interpersonal relationships and provide safe, sober, and nurturing homes for themselves and their families. In the perinatal portion of the program, First Step provides parent education that teaches mothers positive parenting skills and provides a Child Development Center staffed with early education professionals for childcare for mothers participating in First Step services.

Our First Step Perinatal Substance Abuse program had 27 women graduate throughout the year, demonstrating the success of our efforts to support pregnant and postpartum women struggling with substance abuse. These graduates have taken important steps toward building healthier and more stable lives for themselves and their families.

## **Brief Intervention Counseling Team**

The Brief Intervention Counseling Team (BIC-T) provides new access to quality counseling services to adults with moderate to severe mental health symptoms or diagnoses. Our team consists of clinicians, behavioral health specialists, and a peer navigator that provides a wraparound service to our clients. We serve Stanislaus County residents at no cost to them, and no insurance or Medi-Cal is needed. Our goal is to support the uninsured, underinsured, and individuals with high copays for mental health services.

# CHAMPIONS FOR CHILDREN

Building a positive future.

## **Intensive Community Support & Behavioral Health Services Team**

Sierra Vista's Intensive Community Support (ICS) program provides mental health services, including assessment, treatment, and support services in an outpatient setting. Referrals from a variety of sources, including schools, parents/caregivers, and other community partners.

ICS services vary based on individual needs and may include individual and family therapy, case management, rehabilitation, medication support, and crisis intervention. This program supports youth and their families to help reduce stress and impairment in the home, school, and community setting. This results in strengthened family connections and resiliency.

Sierra Vista quickly met the demands of our Intensive Community Support program and with that success a second team was formed with **Behavioral Health Services Team (BHST)**. BHST is a full-service partnership program that provides the most intensive outpatient services to children and youth ages 0-21. The focus is to provide intensive treatment to those who have experienced a crisis, psychiatric hospitalization, incarceration, homelessness, or symptoms and behaviors that may increase the risk for out-of-home placement.

## **LIFE Path (Lasting Independence and Family Empowerment)**

**LIFE Path** is a coordinated specialty care program for early psychosis treatment operated by Sierra Vista Child & Family Services in collaboration with Center for Human Services. LIFE Path helps young people experiencing psychosis reclaim their life goals. This program provides effective treatment and support to transitional-age youth and adults ages 14-25 experiencing early symptoms of psychosis. LIFE Path offers education and support to the family and a support network for youth and adults.

*"LIFE Path is a coordinated specialty care program for early psychosis treatment. LIFE Path helps young people experiencing psychosis reclaim their life goals. Evidence shows that psychosis can be treated if detected early and with the proper interventions. Without appropriate early intervention, studies have shown it costs a community \$1,000,000 to care for a person with long-term untreated schizophrenia throughout their life. LIFE Path is working to give these young clients and their families the skills they need to be productive community members."*

# LEARN, GROW, & THRIVE

Providing services through partnerships that will enhance the health, education, and well-being of the families we serve in Merced County.

Our **Sierra Vista Merced** programs in Merced County offer many services to families in our office and the community. Sierra Vista Merced reaches 16 cities within Merced County. Clinicians provide screening and assessment to students to identify social, emotional, and behavioral symptoms. In addition, individual, family, parent, and crisis counseling are available to assist students with specific issues that significantly interfere with their level of functioning. We work with families with children 0-5, enrolled in Head Start, in school K-12th grade, and families with Alliance Healthcare Services.

## Counseling Services & Prevention Services

**Beacon** - The Central California Alliance for Health (Beacon Health Options) program provides outpatient services for treating mild to moderate mental health impairments.

**Innovative Strategist Network for Youth (ISN-Y)** - This referral-based case management program provides family and clinical services to youth ages 0-17. The ISN-Y program works with youth with mild/moderate mental health issues to support youth in connecting them to needed services within the community.

**R2R (Road to Resiliency)** - This program works with pregnant women with known histories of or current substance use and mothers of substance-exposed infants through interagency collaboration and integration of services. Navigators will provide community health education, navigation of the health care system, and community linkages through a Family Resource Center using a strength-based approach.

## School-Based Services

**Head Start** - This collaborative program between Merced County Office of Education and Sierra Vista provides education and support for parents of children ages 0-5 struggling with social, emotional, and behavioral difficulties.

**iMatter** - This program is for children K-12th grade that teaches social-emotional skills aimed at reducing impulsive and aggressive behavior while increasing social competence. The program aims to improve classroom environments, parenting, and children's behaviors. Through Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI), we promote bullying prevention, breaking the stigma events, and social skills. As a result, 90% of staff and 88% of students were satisfied with the services they received.

**Therapeutic Intervention Program (TIP)** - Provides school-based mental health counseling within schools in the Merced Union High School District, Delhi Unified School District, and Los Banos Unified School District.
