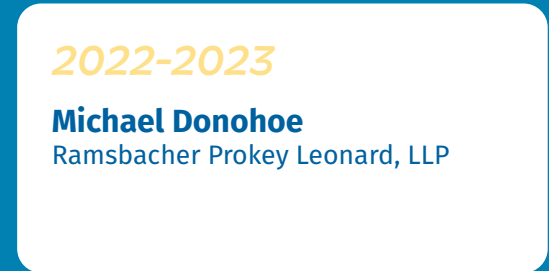

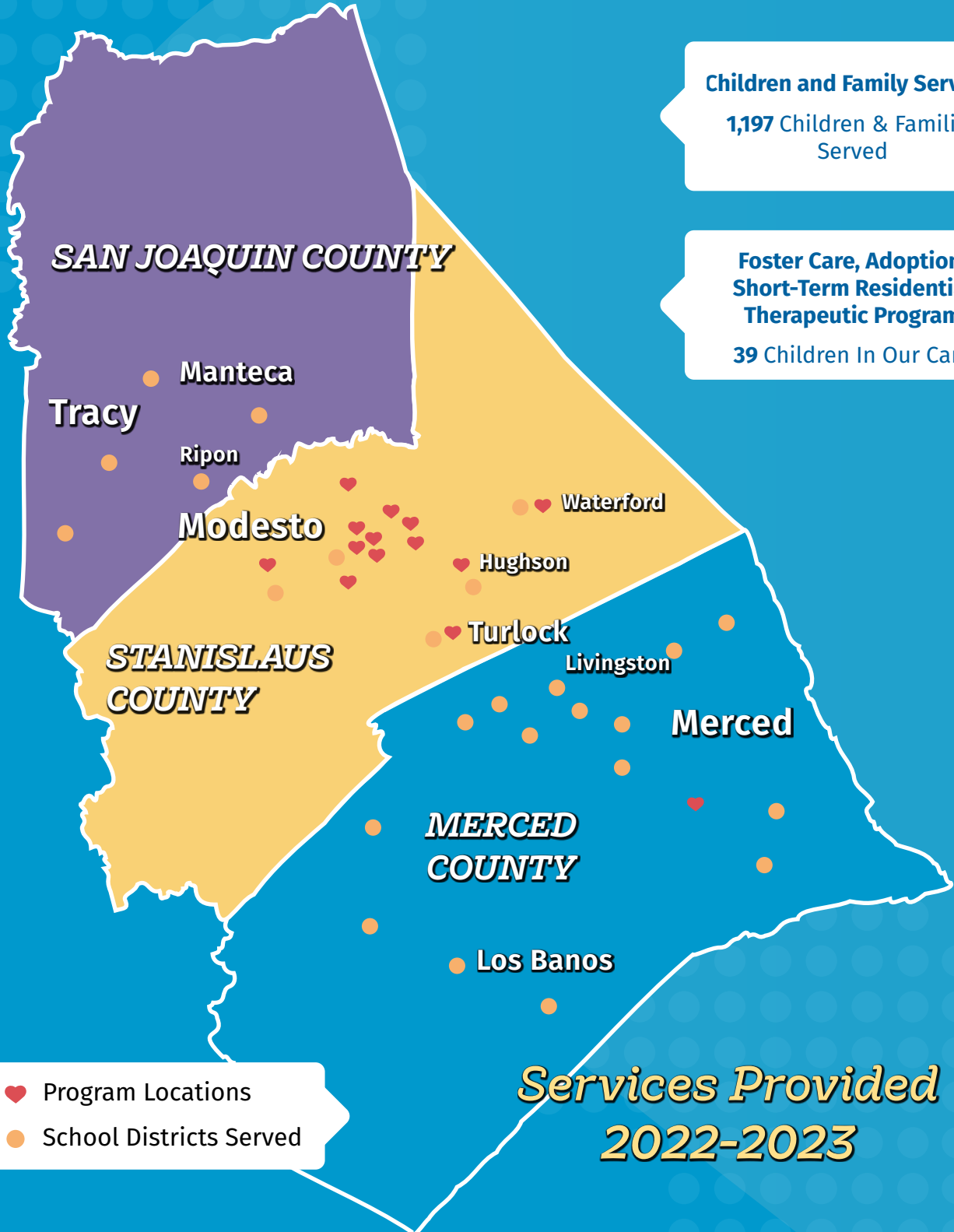

# ***WHERE EVERY CHILD THRIVES***

## **A Unique Approach to Specialized Education and Future Leadership.**

The **Kirk Baucher Non-Public School** offers specialized education for kindergarten through eighth-grade students from public school systems in Merced, Stanislaus, and San Joaquin Counties. Collaborating closely with school districts, we provide tailored training in therapeutic crisis intervention to support each student's Individual Education Plan (IEP) within a therapeutic school environment.

Our specialized school setting delivers individualized education services, social skills development, behavior management, crisis intervention, family support, and one-on-one mental health services. These essential services are provided in an acute therapeutic care setting, which is crucial for this environment.

Education plans are designed to fit the individual needs of each student, kindergarten through eighth grade. We conduct comprehensive academic assessments, offer specialized curriculum for students with learning disabilities (including those on the autism spectrum), and provide vocational education, crisis intervention, an activity program, and social work services to involve the family in their child's treatment plan. **Approximately 70% of 8th graders from Kirk Baucher Non-Public School successfully transitioned back into public schools.**

### ***Pioneering Creative Learning***

Kirk Baucher Non-Public School ignites our student's minds with STEAM, sports, music, and gardening. This vibrant mix of activities goes beyond education, fostering holistic well-being. Students delve into a world where creativity thrives, shaping resilient minds for a brighter tomorrow. At Kirk Baucher, we believe in the power of diverse experiences to unlock the full potential of every student.



# ***EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES, ENRICHING LIVES***

Partnering with local neighborhoods to cultivate growth and transformation.

Our Family Resource Centers work hand in hand with local communities to enhance the well-being of children and families. We ensure easy access to vital programs, services, classes, and support groups, prioritizing their wellness. Across Stanislaus County, our community centers offer a safe space for individuals and families to access resources and cultivate personal growth. **At our Stanislaus County Family Resource Centers, over 3,000 individuals received assistance with housing, food, and utilities.** Together, we're building a brighter and more hopeful future for everyone.

**Drop-In Family Resource Center** is in the heart of West Modesto, strengthening and unifying neighborhoods. Our Youth Assessment Center aims to prevent youth from formally entering the justice system and connect them to local resources.

**Hughson Family Resource Center** serves rural agricultural communities in Southeast Stanislaus County. It provides a variety of community services to strengthen the family.

**North Modesto Family Resource Center** serves families in North Modesto and Salida. It provides a variety of community services to strengthen the family.

**South Modesto Family Resource Center** provides community services to neighborhoods in South Modesto.

**Waterford Family Resource Center** provides services to the cities of Waterford, Hickman, Denair, and La Grange. Our connection to the community enhances the health, education, and well-being of the children and families served.

## ***MENTORING CONNECTIONS THAT TRANSFORM LIVES***

A listening ear, accountability, and a caring role model are all it takes to be a positive role model in a child's life.

Our **Sierra Vista Mentoring Program** brings mentors, students, educators, businesses, community leaders, and community-based organizations together. It empowers them with the knowledge, skills, and training necessary to create a culture of mentoring in our community through becoming our youth's mentors, advocates, and supporters. Our mentoring program works with six elementary schools in the Modesto City Schools District.

Our dedicated volunteer mentors engage with their mentees for one hour per week at the mentee's school. The primary objective is cultivating a positive relationship supporting the mentee's social and academic growth, thereby enhancing their overall school experience. Having a mentor significantly enhances a student's potential for success by providing committed, supportive, and positive role models who believe in them.

**The mentoring program shows its impact in our students' progress, with 76% of mentee caregivers noting improved academic performance. Additionally, 87% of school administrators receive positive feedback from mentee caregivers, confirming the program's meaningful influence on students' lives.**



### ***Mentoring Matters***

The K9 Division of the Modesto Police Department generously provided toys and gifts for the students in our mentoring program, bringing immense joy to the children we serve. Their donation exemplifies a strong community spirit, fostering connection and care among us all.



# ***FOSTERING OUR FUTURE***

Providing a supportive and stable family for children.

Our **Foster Care & Adoption Program** offers secure and nurturing homes for children who have been removed from their biological families. We support these children in achieving permanency through family reunification, establishing lifelong connections, or guardianship. Resource Parents have the opportunity to expand their families through adoption, and Sierra Vista provides ongoing training, social events, and holiday gatherings for our foster youth and their families.

We provide a **Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP)** with two homes located in family-oriented neighborhoods in the community. These children require specialized 24-hour care to ensure their safety and well-being in an environment where they can thrive. Our dedicated and highly trained staff provide caring and nurturing support, and the most current therapeutic and behavioral interventions. As a result of our efforts, **last year, 25% of our children transitioned from our residential homes back to safe family environments.**



## ***A Heart Of Gold***

Adopted children often thrive in their new families, with many sharing they feel loved, secure, and valued. Becoming a Resource Parent offers one of the most rewarding experiences, empowering children by instilling hope for their future. With the support of our Foster Care and Adoption Services, many former foster youth secure stable jobs, paving the way for independence and success. Each of us can contribute to improving the lives of children in need.

## ***PROMOTING LASTING FAMILY WELL-BEING***

Services that support adults in developing positive skills while learning to live a healthy and safe life.

### **Adult & Community Services**

Our program provides individual and family counseling services focused on child safety, permanency and stability, child well-being, and family well-being to keep children in their homes or reunify them with their parents. Adult & Community Services provides parenting groups that teach methods to prevent and break the cycle of family violence, anger management, and parenting education focused on identifying the development and emotional needs of the child.

### **First Step Substance Abuse Treatment Program**

The First Step Substance Abuse Treatment Program aims to assist women in maintaining a drug and alcohol-free lifestyle. First Step provides substance use treatment and gender-specific substance use treatment. Women are taught skills to develop and maintain healthy interpersonal relationships and provide safe, sober, and nurturing homes for themselves and their families. In the perinatal portion of the program, First Step provides parent education that teaches mothers positive parenting skills and provides a Child Development Center staffed with early education professionals for childcare for mothers participating in First Step services.

**Our First Step Substance Abuse program served 154 women and 73 children, demonstrating the success of our efforts to support pregnant and postpartum women struggling with substance abuse.** These graduates have taken necessary steps toward building healthier and more stable lives for themselves and their families.

# **CHAMPIONS FOR CHILDREN**

## Building a positive future.

### **Intensive Community Support (ICS)**

Our program provides mental health services, including assessment, treatment, and support services in an outpatient setting. Referrals from various sources, including schools, parents/caregivers, and other community partners.

Intensive Community Support has services vary based on individual needs and may include individual and family therapy, case management, rehabilitation, medication support, and crisis intervention. This program supports youth and their families to help reduce stress and impairment in the home, school, and community setting. This results in strengthened family connections and resiliency.

### **Behavioral Health Services Team (BHST)**

This program is a full-service partnership program that provides the most intensive outpatient services to children and youth ages 0-21. The focus is to deliver intensive treatment to those who have experienced a crisis, psychiatric hospitalization, incarceration, homelessness, or symptoms and behaviors that may increase the risk for out-of-home placement.


### **LIFE Path (Lasting Independence and Family Empowerment)**

**LIFE Path** is a coordinated specialty care program for early psychosis treatment, helping young people experiencing psychosis reclaim their life goals. This program provides effective treatment and support to transitional-age youth and adults ages 14-25 experiencing early symptoms of psychosis. LIFE Path offers education and support to the family and a support network for youth and adults.

### **Enhanced Care Management (ECM)**

Enhanced Care Management is a new program in partnership with local health plans designed to connect quality resources and services by providing comprehensive support and coordination for individuals with complex medical needs. ECM prioritizes enhancing overall health outcomes and quality of life for these individuals.

## ***LEARN, GROW, & THRIVE***

Providing services through partnerships that enhance the health, education, and well-being of youth and families in Merced County.

### **Counseling Services & Prevention Services**

**Carelon Behavioral Health Strategies** - The Central California Alliance for Health (Beacon Health Options) program provides outpatient services for treating mild to moderate mental health impairments.

**R2R (Road to Resiliency)** - This program focuses on pregnant women with substance use histories or current substance use and mothers of substance-exposed infants through interagency collaboration and integration of services. Navigators provide community health education, navigation of the health care system, and community linkages through a Family Resource Center using a strength-based approach.

**Enhanced Care Management (ECM)** - Enhanced Care Management is a new program in partnership with local health plans designed to connect quality resources and services by providing comprehensive support and coordination for individuals with complex medical needs. ECM prioritizes enhancing overall health outcomes and quality of life for these individuals.

### **School-Based Services**

**Head Start** - This collaborative program between the Merced County Office of Education and Sierra Vista provides education and support for parents of children ages 0-5 struggling with social, emotional, and behavioral difficulties.

**iMatter** - Geared towards children in K-12th grade, this program teaches social-emotional skills to reduce impulsive and aggressive behavior while enhancing social competence. Through Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI), we promote bullying prevention, breaking the stigma events, and social skills.

**Therapeutic Intervention Program (TIP)** - Provides school-based mental health counseling within schools in the Merced Union High School District, Delhi Unified School District, and Los Banos Unified School District.
