South Modesto Wellness Center

Lasting Change



Sierra Vista Child & Family Services is proud to introduce the South Modesto Wellness Center, a welcoming space where youth and families can access essential resources, mental health support, and opportunities—all under one roof. For too long, this community has faced barriers to vital services such as healthcare, job training, and education. This new center is a step toward closing those gaps and fostering lasting change.

By collaborating with public and private partners, the Wellness Center brings comprehensive care directly to the community, improving health outcomes and expanding opportunities. Access to care is a right, not a privilege, and this center is built on that belief.

"This is more than just a building. Family-Focused: Services are designed to meet individual needs in a flexible, family-focused, and culturally sensitive environment.

Strength-Based Approach: Services are designed to be unique to each individual and draw on their strengths to help them reach their goals.

Localized Collaboration: Operating as a community hub, the South Modesto Wellness Center will foster connections among families and local community resources.







Youth & Family Services

Compassionate support for every youth and family in our community.

Intensive Community Support (ICS)

Our ICS program offers vital mental health services to youth ages 0 to 21, including therapy, crisis intervention, and case management. Referrals come from schools, parents, and community partners, ensuring youth and families can access personalized services such as individual and family therapy, case management, rehabilitation, medication support, and crisis intervention.

Sierra Vista bridges this gap by serving Medi-Cal-eligible families, promoting resilience and well-being in homes, schools, and communities.

Behavioral Health Services Team (BHST)

BHST provides critical mental health services to youth (0-21) on Medi-Cal in Stanislaus County, offering assessment, treatment, and crisis support. Referrals come from schools, caregivers, and community partners. BHST offers an Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) level of care, which provides 24-hour support to families as needed.

Our team provides thousands of hours of therapy, crisis stabilization, and case management services each year. Addressing mental health early, we help youth improve school performance, strengthen family relationships, and develop coping skills that lead to long-term well-being and success.

LIFE Path (Lasting Independence and Family Empowerment)

Our LIFE Path program empowers youth and young adults (14-25) experiencing early psychosis to reclaim their goals through effective treatment and family support. With early intervention, recovery is possible—highlighting the critical role of programs like LIFE Path in transforming lives and fostering independence.

Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program

Our Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP) provides 24-hour, specialized care for youth ages 6-13 facing emotional and behavioral challenges. Located in a family-oriented neighborhood, our home offers a safe and nurturing environment where youth receive tailored therapy, crisis intervention, and medication support.

STRTP helps some of the most vulnerable youth in our community heal and grow. Each child receives individualized care, building confidence and emotional resilience to transition to a home-based setting successfully. We empower youth to envision and achieve a brighter future through behavioral and culturally responsive support.

Enhanced Care Management

Enhanced Care Management (ECM) partners with local health plans to provide coordinated, person-centered care for individuals with complex medical and social needs. Through comprehensive, community-based support. ECM improves health outcomes and quality of life. By coordinating care across medical, mental health, and social services, we help families access the resources they need for stability and wellness.

When our ECM staff first met a new client, she and her husband slept in the park—sometimes in the bushes or under picnic tables. She had a serious leg wound that wasn't being treated, and their children were staying with others, separated from them.

That was in June 2024. Today, their family is reunited, her infection has healed, and they are working toward stability. They're staying at a local homeless shelter and hotels while we help them secure permanent housing. Her husband has also joined our program, receiving medical care, including dental and vision services, and access to needed prescriptions.

This family has come such a long way in just a few months. They still have challenges ahead, but they're no longer just surviving—they're rebuilding. Their journey reminds us why we do this work: to help people find their way back to hope, health, and home.

Merced County Programs

Enhancing the health, education, and well-being of youth and families.



Every day, our programs support youth and families in Merced County through school-based counseling, mental health services, and family support. We bridge critical gaps in care, helping individuals build resilience and thrive.

Counseling Services & Prevention Services

Through Carelon Behavioral Health Strategies, in partnership with the Central California Alliance for Health, we provide outpatient counseling for those facing mild to moderate mental health challenges, ensuring access to essential care.

Our Enhanced Care Management (ECM) program connects families with complex medical and social needs to health services, housing assistance, and mental health resources, helping them navigate healthcare.

Road to Resiliency (R2R) supports pregnant women with substance use histories and mothers of substance-exposed infants. Our Navigators connect them to health services, education, and resources, empowering them to build healthier futures.

School-Based Services

We collaborate with the Merced County Office of Education and Merced Community Action Agency to provide free or low-cost early childhood services at 25 sites through State Preschool and Head Start programs.

Through iMatter, we equip kindergarten-12th grade students with social-emotional skills, helping them manage emotions, reduce aggression, and build confidence. Our efforts include bullying prevention and mental health awareness at 13 schools, reaching over 3,000 residents.

In schools throughout Merced County, our Therapeutic Intervention Program (TIP) provides in-school counseling, ensuring students have access to mental health support when they need it most.

Adult Services

Promoting a balanced, healthy, and safe life.



Adult & Community Services

Our program provides individual and family counseling services focused on child safety, permanency and stability, child well-being, and family well-being to keep youth in their homes or reunify them with their parents. Adult & Community Services provides parenting groups that teach methods to prevent and break the cycle of family violence, anger management, and parenting education focused on identifying the development and emotional needs of the child.

First Step Substance Abuse Treatment Program

The First Step Substance Abuse Treatment Program aims to assist women in maintaining a drug and alcohol-free lifestyle. First Step provides gender-specific substance use treatment. Women are taught skills to develop and maintain healthy interpersonal relationships and provide safe, sober, and nurturing homes for themselves and their families. In the perinatal portion of the program, First Step provides parent education that teaches mothers positive parenting skills while their children (0-5 years of age) are in our Child Development Center staffed with early education professionals for childcare for mothers participating in First Step services.

Family Resource Centers

Partnering with local neighborhoods to cultivate growth and transformation.

> At Sierra Vista Child & Family Services, our Family **Resource Centers (FRCs)** are dedicated to enhancing the well-being of youth and families throughout Stanislaus County. We provide accessible programs, services, classes, and support groups to foster personal growth and community wellness.

Our FRCs are conveniently located across Stanislaus County, including West Modesto, Hughson, North Modesto, South Modesto, and Waterford. Each center is a safe space for individuals and families to access resources and support.

By working hand in hand with local communities, we are building a brighter and more hopeful future for the youth and families we serve.

Case Management: Our case managers, staff, and Promotoras act as liaisons between healthcare providers and community members, ensuring residents receive the medical services they need.

Community Referrals: Our centers connect individuals to essential services such as housing assistance, food, diapers, support groups, prenatal care, medical services, and counseling.

Parent Education Support Groups: Available in both English and Spanish, these groups cover topics like positive discipline, managing challenging behaviors, school readiness, and child development. Simultaneously, youth can participate in social skills

Health Education & Outreach: We provide fitness and nutrition classes, assistance with insurance enrollment and CalFresh applications, and organize community health fairs to promote overall wellness.

Family Literacy and School Readiness: Our activities prepare youth and parents for educational success, including family literacy programs and English as a Second Language classes.

Youth Assessment Center (YAC): Aimed at preventing youth from entering the justice system, YAC employs restorative justice practices and connects young individuals to resources that promote resilience and positive community involvement.

Clothes Closet: We provide clothing for youth and parents, including attire suitable for those re-entering the workforce. Access is determined on a case-by-case basis and is available by appointment.



Sierra Vista Mentoring Program

Creating a Culture of Mentorship for Our Youth

The **Sierra Vista Mentoring Program** connects mentors, students, educators, businesses, and community leaders to create a culture of mentorship. By providing training and resources, the program empowers volunteers to serve as advocates and role models for youth in our community. Partnering with six elementary schools in the Modesto City Schools District, the program fosters meaningful relationships that inspire students to succeed.

Mentors dedicate one hour per week to meet with their mentees at school, focusing on building trust and supporting social and academic growth. These relationships are critical in improving students' confidence, resilience, and overall school experience. Having a mentor can significantly enhance a child's potential, offering them the guidance and encouragement they need to thrive.

Why Mentorship Matters

- According to Mentor National's research, students with mentors are 55% more likely to enroll in college.
- In Stanislaus County, where 20% of youth live below the poverty line, programs like ours ensure every student has someone who believes in their success.

Our mentors do more than teach; they provide a safe space for their mentees. By offering unwavering encouragement, they help students build confidence, set goals, and envision brighter futures. Together, we are shaping a community where every child knows they have the support to thrive.



Kirk Baucher Non-Public School

Where Every Student Thrives

The **Kirk Baucher Non-Public School** provides specialized education for kindergarten through eighthgrade students from public school systems in Merced, Stanislaus, and San Joaquin Counties. We work closely with local school districts to deliver tailored training in therapeutic crisis intervention, supporting each student's Individual Education Plan (IEP) in a therapeutic school environment.

Our specialized setting offers individualized education services, social skills development, behavior management, crisis intervention, family support, and one-on-one mental health services. These essential services are delivered within an acute therapeutic care setting, which is vital for our program.

Education plans are customized to meet the specific needs of each student in kindergarten through eighth grade. We conduct comprehensive academic assessments, provide a specialized curriculum for students with learning disabilities (including those on the autism spectrum), and offer vocational education, crisis intervention, an activity program, and social work services to engage families in the treatment plan.

70% of 8th graders from Kirk Baucher Non-Public School successfully transitioned back into public schools.

"Since 2014, I have supported, volunteered, and mentored with Sierra Vista, dedicating my time to helping raise funds and making a direct impact by mentoring elementary students. I first met the staff during a community event and was deeply impressed by their programs, which inspired me to get involved. As I became more engaged, I witnessed firsthand how these programs truly address the community's needs. Seeing the mentoring program grow over the years and its transformative impact on students was eye-opening. I realized that dedicating just one hour a week could change a child's life.

I have been mentoring my current mentee for four years. I was excited to meet him when he was in first grade, but unfortunately, he was suspended during our first week and again in the second week. By the third week, with some hesitation, I finally met him—a charming and inquisitive boy who won my heart immediately. From that moment on, I returned every week, and our relationship blossomed. Some days are filled with games and laughter; other days, we have meaningful conversations about behavior and making good choices. I know that our relationship is having a meaningful impact on his life.

Every time we meet, he fills my heart. Even on challenging days, I am committed to being there for him when he misbehaves. Over time, I have witnessed incredible growth—his attendance has improved, and he is more engaged in class. He's learning to make better choices, and I can see his confidence blossoming. I believe that any difference we make, no matter how small, matters. Showing up for just one hour each week can profoundly impact a child's life, and that's something I wholeheartedly embrace."
