

Support, Without the Gaps

Strengthening care through Enhanced Care Management

For individuals and families in Stanislaus and Merced counties, finding their way through health care and community services can feel overwhelming, especially when needs are complex. Through Enhanced Care Management, Sierra Vista offers a steady option. Someone to walk alongside them and help make sense of what comes next.

Our team helps families take that first step. With guidance and consistent support, people can connect to care, follow through on services, and feel more confident navigating systems that once felt out of reach.

"We care deeply about the people we serve. There is so much support available in our community, and our role is helping families understand what's out there and connect to what they need."

By partnering with local health plans, our program supports better health and quality of life. We see people keep appointments, better understand their care, and feel more supported along the way. Over time, that connection leads to greater stability and a stronger sense of well-being.



A Community of Support

Youth and Family Services

Strong communities begin with care that meets people where they are.

Through **Intensive Community Support**, children and teens receive therapy, case management, and crisis support tailored to their needs. Families feel guided as they work through challenges together, and young people build skills that support daily life.

For those needing a higher level of care, the **Behavioral Health Services Team** provides intensive support that extends beyond office hours. With 24-hour assistance and individualized treatment, families experience greater stability, and youth develop coping skills that strengthen school and family relationships.

Young adults experiencing early psychosis are supported through **LIFE Path**, a program focused on recovery, goal-setting, and family involvement. Early intervention helps participants move forward with confidence and independence.

Some youth benefit from a safe, structured environment to heal and grow. The **Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program** offers 24-hour care for children facing emotional or behavioral challenges, combining therapy, crisis support, and medication services in a nurturing setting.

Enhanced Care Management helps youth and families stay connected to care by coordinating health, mental health, and community services. By reducing barriers and simplifying complex systems, ECM supports stronger outcomes and improved quality of life.

Youth gain the tools and support they need to heal, grow, and move forward. Families feel trusted and supported during difficult moments, and young people find stability, connection, and a path toward thriving.



Strengthening Stability at Home

Adult Services

Strong families are built through trust, consistency, and support. These values matter most during life's most difficult moments. Sierra Vista's Adult and Community Services helps families strengthen relationships, create safe homes, and work toward stability.

Through **Adult & Community Services**, we counsel individuals and families and provide parenting support that prioritizes safety, permanency, and well-being. Parents build skills to understand their children's emotions, improve communication, and break cycles of conflict.

The **First Step Substance Use Disorder Treatment Program** supports women in recovery. This gender-specific program focuses on healing and growth. Participants build tools for sobriety, healthier relationships, and safe, nurturing homes.

In the perinatal program, staff support both mother and child. Mothers participate in treatment and parenting education, while their young children experience a nurturing early learning environment. This integrated approach helps families pursue recovery, bonding, and lasting stability.

Together, these services support adults as they strengthen themselves and their families, helping create healthier homes and stronger communities.

The Lasting Impact of Showing Up

Sierra Vista Mentoring Program

The Sierra Vista Mentoring Program brings together mentors, students, educators, businesses, and community leaders to create a culture of mentorship rooted in connection and care. By equipping volunteers with training and support, the program empowers everyday people to show up as trusted role models and advocates for youth.

Partnering with elementary schools in the Modesto City Schools District, mentors meet with students on campus for just one hour each week. In that time, relationships grow. Trust is built. Students gain confidence, feel seen, and begin to believe in their own potential.

Mentorship is not about fixing problems. It is about consistency, encouragement, and having someone who listens. For many students, that steady presence makes a meaningful difference in how they experience school and how they see themselves.



Students with mentors are **52%** less likely to skip school.



Youth who have mentors are **55%** more likely to enroll in college.



Why Mentorship Matters

Research shows that students with mentors are more likely to stay engaged in school and pursue higher education. In Stanislaus County, where many youth face economic and social barriers, mentorship helps close the gap by ensuring students do not navigate challenges alone.

Mentors provide a safe space to talk, dream, and grow. Through simple moments and shared time, students learn to set goals, build resilience, and imagine brighter futures. Together, these relationships strengthen not only individual students but the community as a whole.

Bridging Care in Merced County

Merced County Programs

Sierra Vista supports youth and families across Merced County where they live, learn, and grow. We provide counseling, school-based programs, and coordinated care to help children and families overcome challenges and thrive in their communities.

Counseling and Prevention

Through **Central California Alliance for Health**, youth and families receive outpatient counseling for mild to moderate mental health challenges. The focus is on accessible, consistent care that builds practical skills for emotional well-being and everyday resilience.

For families navigating complex medical, behavioral, or social challenges, **Enhanced Care Management (ECM)** provides coordination across health services, housing, and community resources. This approach reduces barriers and supports long-term stability.

School-Based

In partnership with the Merced County Office of Education, **Head Start** supports children and parents facing social, emotional, and behavioral challenges. Education and family support help families build confidence, stability, and readiness for school.

Through **iMatter**, students in kindergarten through 12th grade strengthen social-emotional skills, manage emotions, and build healthy relationships. Students gain confidence, develop positive connections, and participate more fully in school life.

Merced County State Preschools provide mental health consultation, staff training, and parent support to promote emotional development and family confidence.

When students need mental health support, the **Therapeutic Intervention Program (TIP)** provides school-based counseling in the Merced Union High School District and Los Banos Unified School District. By offering services on campus, TIP ensures timely access to care and reduces barriers to learning.



Students gain critical social-emotional skills and access to counseling, helping them build confidence, navigate challenges, and succeed in school and life.



A Place Families Turn To

Family Resource Centers

At Sierra Vista's Family Resource Centers, families find more than services. They find people who listen, understand, and walk alongside them. Located throughout Stanislaus County in West Modesto, Hughson, North Modesto, and South Modesto, each center is rooted in its neighborhood and designed to feel safe, welcoming, and accessible.

Support begins with partnership. Through **Case Management** and **Community Referrals**, staff and Promotoras help families navigate healthcare systems and connect them to essentials like housing assistance, food, diapers, prenatal care, medical services, support groups, and counseling. This guidance helps families feel less overwhelmed and more confident as they move forward.

Families also access **Mental Health Counseling**, where youth and adults receive individual and family support that builds emotional tools for daily life at home, at school, and beyond.

Growth continues through **Parent Education Support Groups**, offered in English and Spanish. Parents explore positive discipline, child development, and school readiness, while youth build social skills.

Wellness is strengthened through **Health Education & Outreach**, including nutrition and fitness classes, help with insurance enrollment and CalFresh applications, and community health fairs.

Early learning and educational success are supported through **Family Literacy and School Readiness**, including family literacy activities and English-as-a-Second-Language classes. For youth at risk of entering the justice system, the **Youth**

Assessment Center (YAC) offers an alternative path through restorative justice practices and community connections.

When basic needs arise, families can turn to the **Clothes Closet** for clothing for youth and adults, including work-ready attire.

Together, our Family Resource Centers serve as places of care and connection, supporting families today while strengthening the communities they call home.



Families who access our centers gain clear pathways to care, including mental health counseling, housing, and food support.



Parents build confidence and skills that strengthen family relationships and support children's development.



Youth are supported at an early age, helping prevent crises and promote long-term stability at home and in school.

Where Every Student Thrives

Kirk Baucher Non-Public School

The Kirk Baucher Non-Public School provides specialized education for kindergarten through eighth grade. Our students come from public school systems in Stanislaus, Merced, San Joaquin, Calaveras, and Alameda Counties. We work closely with local school districts. Together, we deliver tailored training in therapeutic crisis intervention and support each student's Individual Education Plan (IEP) in a therapeutic school environment.


Our setting offers individualized education, social skills development, behavior management, crisis intervention, family support, and one-on-one mental health services. We deliver these essential services within an acute

therapeutic care setting. This therapeutic setting is vital for our program.

We customize education plans to meet each student's needs in kindergarten through eighth grade. Our team conducts comprehensive academic assessments and offers a specialized curriculum for students with learning disabilities, including autism spectrum disorders. We also provide vocational education, crisis intervention, an activity program, and social work services. Families are engaged in the treatment plan.



70% of 8th graders from Kirk Baucher Non-Public School successfully transitioned back into public schools.
